## Symposium Mission

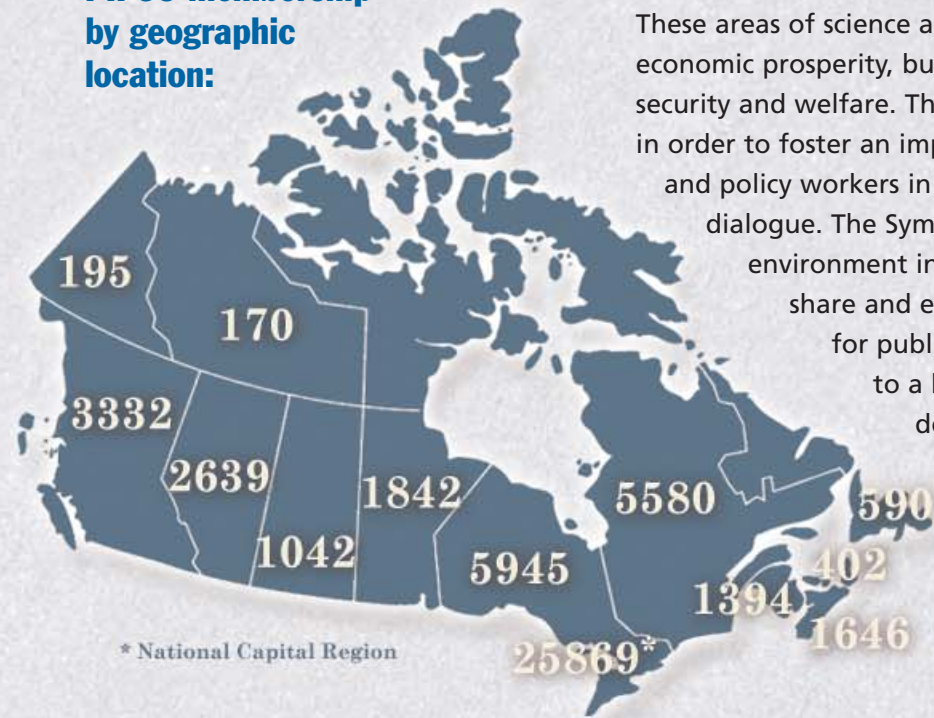
